PPRAG 1338 Pharmacy Based Screenings (1.5qhrs)

Instructor: Dr. Kimberly Johnson Description: Through active participation in lecture discussions as well as laboratory exercises, the student will be prepared to develop health-screening programs in a variety of pharmacy practice settings. The focus is risk factor assessment and hands-on experience with technological devices related to cancer, cardiovascular disease (blood pressure and cholesterol), diabetes, and osteoporosis. This course will address OSHA training, CLIA regulations, policies and procedures, and implementation of screening programs. The course meets once weekly for either lecture or a lab/workshop. The course evaluation is based upon competency assessment of techniques during the lab/workshop, two group projects, and a final quiz. **Pre-reguisite:** PHIDG 1605 Integrated Sequence 5.

PPRAG 1442 Advanced Geriatric Pharmacotherapy (1.5qhrs)

Course Director: Dr. Nicole Early

Description: This course is designed to enhance students' knowledge and skills related to geriatric pharmacotherapy. The course will provide an introduction to general principles of aging, roles of pharmacists in working with geriatric patients, and an overview of geriatric syndromes. The format of the course will involve brief lectures, and students will be expected to actively participate in discussions and case-based assignments. There will be an emphasis on managing the health care needs of patients with multiple comorbidities.

Prerequisite: Concurrent enrollment in or completion of PHIDG 1606 / PHIDG 1607

PSCIG 1357 Introduction to Forensic Sciences for Healthcare Professionals (1.5qhrs)

Instructor: Dr. Oliver Grundmann

Description: Forensic Sciences has become popular through TV series such as "CSI" and documentaries. However, the relevance of Forensic Toxicology and especially the increased abuse of licit and illicit drugs affect many professionals working in a healthcare related field. This course is intended to introduce the main areas of Forensic Sciences and especially the involvement of healthcare professionals such as physicians, pharmacists, and nurses in discovering and preventing the abuse of drugs. The course will present techniques used in Forensic Sciences to secure and analyze commonly encountered specimens as well as describe the epidemiology, pharmacology, toxicology, medicinal chemistry, and clinical manifestation of the most commonly abused drugs. **Prerequisite:** PPRAG 1524 Pharmacy Law and Public Policy.

IPECG 1401C Improving Patient Safety 1 (1.5qhrs)

Course Directors: Dr. Cara Copeland (CDMA), Dr. Larry Sands (AZCOM); Dr. Shawn Tennant (CPG)

Description: This interprofessional on-line course will introduce students to how they can improve patient safety and reduce medical errors. The course instruction is through on-line Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) educational modules, reinforcing that knowledge through authentic-team case study discussions and self-reflection writings. **Completion of IPECG 1401 and IPECG 1402** will lead to an IHI certificate.
